EXHIBITION AND EVENT INDUSTRY TRAINEESHIPS NSW – COMMENCING SEMESTER 1 2018

1. Traineeship for organisers, suppliers and administration roles (SIT30517 Certificate III Events)
2. Traineeship for staging and technical service roles (CUA30415 Certificate III in Live Production)

Traineeships combine paid work in a real job and structured training. A full-time trainee is employed under a training contract to work for 38 hours per week. Trainees work with some independence under the guidance of more senior staff. The structured training will be delivered by TAFE NSW Ultimo and will be timetabled in consultation with employers to ensure flexibility during peak periods.

WHAT EXACTLY IS AN APPRENTICESHIP OR TRAINEESHIP?

Apprentices are trained in a skilled trade, such as electrical work or cookery. Trainees are trained in a vocational area, such as office administration, event and exhibition operations, production, technology and so on. On successful completion of the program a trainee receives a Certificate qualification in their vocational area.

EMPLOYER BENEFITS?

Traineeships offer the opportunity of recruiting a well-trained employee who is gaining qualifications and skills tailored to your organisation along with other potential benefits.

- Trainees can be a source of new talent for employers
- Workforce development from the ground up and improved staff retention
- Trainees can contribute to your bottom line with practical skills and knowledge gained through their training
- Financial incentives and benefits are available to employers of trainees

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

Traineeship wage rates can be accessed through the FairWork Ombudsman website. The training course fee is NSW government subsidised and costs \$1000 per trainee. This fee may be paid by the trainer or employer.
